Rationale

This event celebrates **beauty understood as the harmony between environmental responsibility, cultural heritage, and social and ethical well-being**. By weaving together care for the environment, appreciation of local art and history, and support for ethical and social initiatives, it seeks to embody the very values it wishes to promote: **accounting as a discipline capable of shaping a more sustainable and inclusive world**.

This guiding vision also inspired the choices for **catering services**. Coffee breaks and lunches are provided by *Ti Cucino Bio*, a social cooperative that combines gastronomy with ethics. Their activity is rooted in principles of solidarity, inclusion, and respect for both people and the environment. They are committed to offering meals prepared with organic, seasonal, and locally sourced ingredients, while at the same time creating training and employment opportunities for vulnerable individuals. In line with their philosophy of responsibility, *Ti Cucino Bio* follows a careful food surplus policy: non-perishable leftovers are redistributed to social projects.

Sustainability has also shaped the design of the **materials and gifts**. All items are eco-friendly: cotton tote bags, pens made of straw, and even a handcrafted soap bar made with the wine served during the convivial moments, thus embracing the principles of **circular economy**, where resources are reused and transformed to create new value.

Finally, the program is also an occasion to honor the **beauty of the territory** that hosts us. Through a guided tour and a dinner in the extraordinary setting of *Piazza dei Miracoli*, participants will be invited to celebrate the artistic and cultural heritage that constitutes both our history and a shared responsibility for the future.

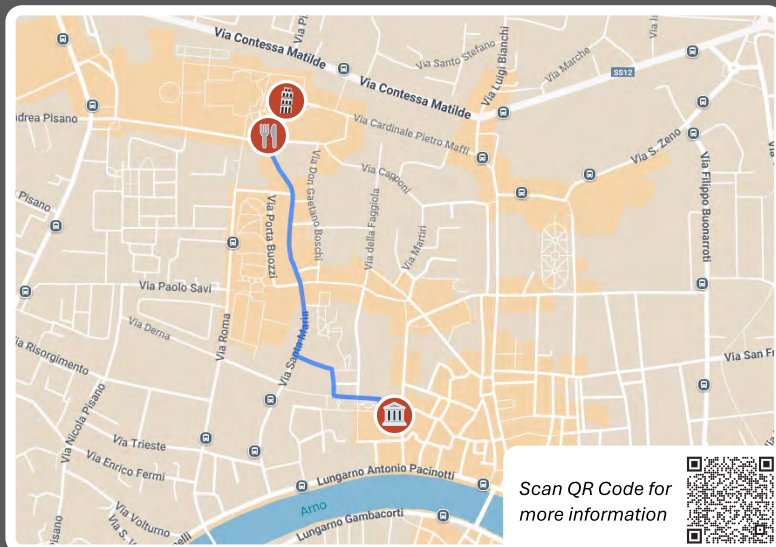
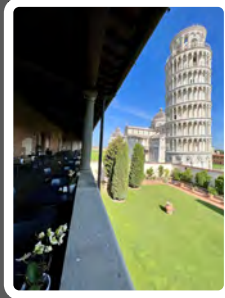
